




Welcome to Chile, "Where the world ends"!

Chile, as you may know, is the *longest and* southest country in the world. It's 4.329 km length from north to south is a tenth of the earth's circumference. It is also the narrowest country, with an average width of only 180 km (between the Andes Mountains and the Pacific Ocean), meaning that you can go from the mountains to the beach in 3 hours, Isn't it amazing? In the north, Chile borders with Perú, Bolivia on the

Northeast and Argentina on the east and, of course, on the west with the wonderful but cold Pacific Ocean.

Climate is quite diverse. Varies from hot, arid and sunny in the north to cold, damp and snowy in the south. Chile is home to some of the world's' natural wonders, The Atacama Desert, the driest desert in the world, the Andes Mountains and the Patagonia, the most southern tip of the world, where you can find the most amazing penguin colonies.

Among Latin American countries, *Chile is considered the safest one*, with stable public institutions, the best healthcare and social welfare of the region and modern infrastructure.

Spanish is our official language in Chile, but there are also quite a few indigenous languages such as *Mapudungun*, *spoken by the Mapuche people of the Araucanía* (in the south) and Aymara, spoken by the Aymara people in the north of the country.

Chile, also known as "The Country of Poets" is the birthplace of famous artists, mainly in writing and poetry, such as Gabriela Mistral, the first Latin American to be awarded the Nobel Prize for Literature in 1945, and Pablo Neruda, who received it in 1971. Other renowned Chilean writers are Nicanor Parra, Isabel Allende and Alejandro Jodorowsky.

Football or soccer is the most popular sport in Chile. People of all ages play soccer in the streets or anywhere there is a ball. **The Chilean soccer team**, locally known as "La Roja", has been champion of the **America Cup twice**, in 2015 and 2016. Have you heard about **Alexis Sanchez and Arturo Vidal?**
